

Year 8 SOL – Autumn Term – Unit 1: Responsibility

The Autumn term consists of 14 weeks which allows for 28 focused tutor lessons. This will then be followed by a theme of the week assembly each Wednesday by myself.

During these lessons' students will focus on aspects of our RESPECT agenda. I want student to explore the importance of responsibility and the many forms and shapes these come in. Please see core skills below. Students will develop of an awareness of a responsibly over 26 lessons which will link to a weekly themed assembly reviewing their work in tutor.

Definition. Responsibility – The ability to recognise that you and we have a duty to deal with something and be accountable for our actions. That we have a responsibility that mat have control over someone or somebody's feelings, behaviour.

These are the core skills. The main skill/skills targeted by the tutor sessions and HOY assembly are highlighted below.
