Behaviour Points are deducted when a student has not demonstrated a CARE value.

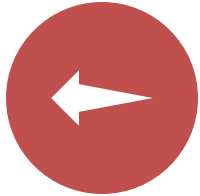

The Curriculum


At Myton we provide an inclusive, broad and balanced curriculum that meets the needs of all our students and is personalised where needed. Our intent is.....

- **To develop self- assured learners;** young people who have a desire to master their subjects beyond the requirements of exam boards, who can articulate their learning journey, who know their strengths and weaknesses and who take reasoned actions to improve their knowledge and understanding.
- **For all students to achieve aspirational outcomes** regardless of their starting points, ensuring barriers are overcome.
- **To ensure all students have memorable experiences** beyond the classroom which complement the broad curriculum within the classroom and inspire a love of learning.
- **To support lifelong** success by ensuring students have the right knowledge and personal characteristics to thrive in modern Britain and the world.

In **Key Stage 3**, students are placed in different groups for different subject blocks – these may be broadly banded or mixed ability.

- **The Core:** English, Maths, Science, World Views, PE, PSHE
- **Arts:** Art, Drama, Music & Design Technology
- **Humanities:** Geography and History
- **Computer Science:** taught explicitly in Year 7 and 8
- **Languages:** Spanish and either French or German

For students who need it, there is additional Literacy, Reading, Numeracy intervention plus a variety of other support classes.

How We Support

-
- Emphasis on getting to know students and families, direct contact with Form Tutors and Pastoral Leader
 - **Myton School is your school now – ask questions**
 - Becoming familiar with staff and the school site
 - **SEND Team - additional visits to primary schools are being planned**
 - Opportunity to speak to our SEND Team during Transition
 - **Share your experiences and learning needs**
 - Focus on all aspects of additional needs – creation of Pupil Passports so staff get to know you better



Mental Health and Wellbeing

- During any transition period, it's important that children can talk about their worries with a trusted adult. Encourage open conversations.
- Remember that it is normal to feel nervous when facing new situations. It may take time to feel completely settled and happy in school, and that's OK.
- Taking small, age-appropriate steps to increase independence now will help you feel ready for secondary school
- Most children will manage the transition successfully, but for those who struggle there is plenty of support available at Myton. You can contact us if you're worried about your child's mental health and there is information and signposting on our school website.

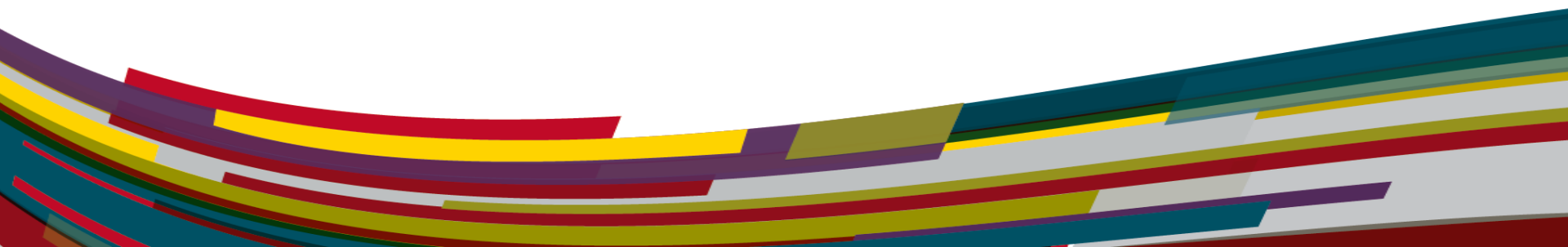

Admission Agreements and Admission Forms

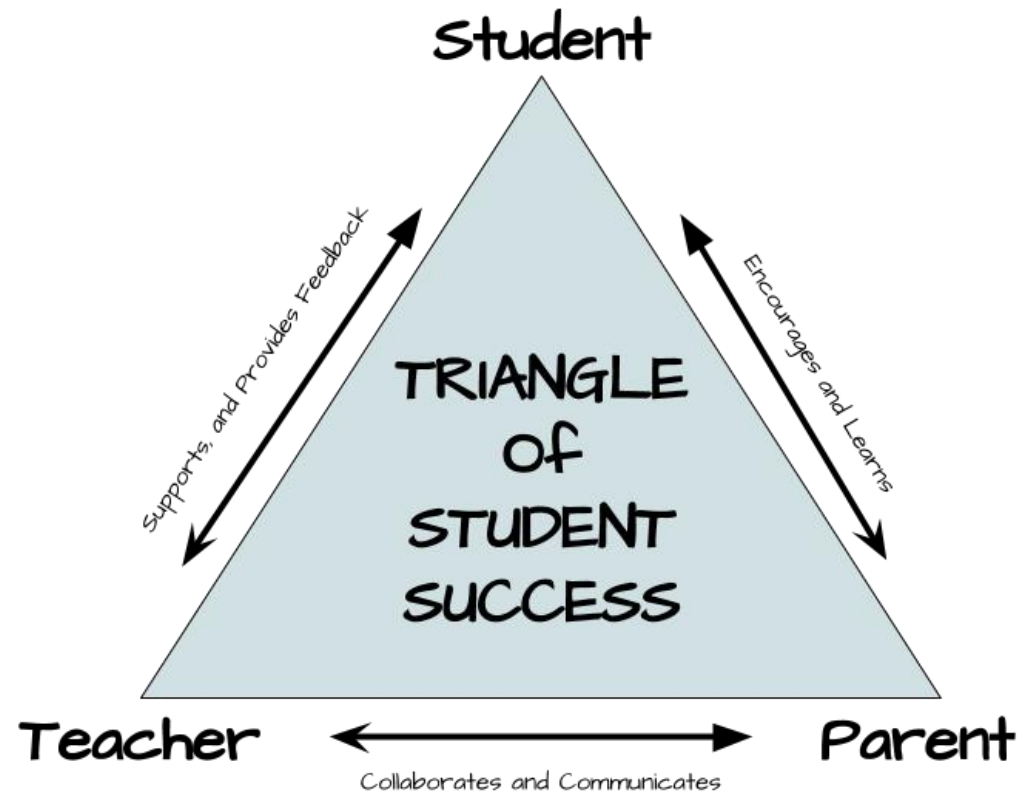
You have received a document from SchoolPost (*which is our online school/home communication system*). The documents included need to be **read** and the form **completed**.
